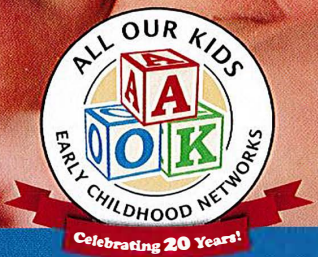
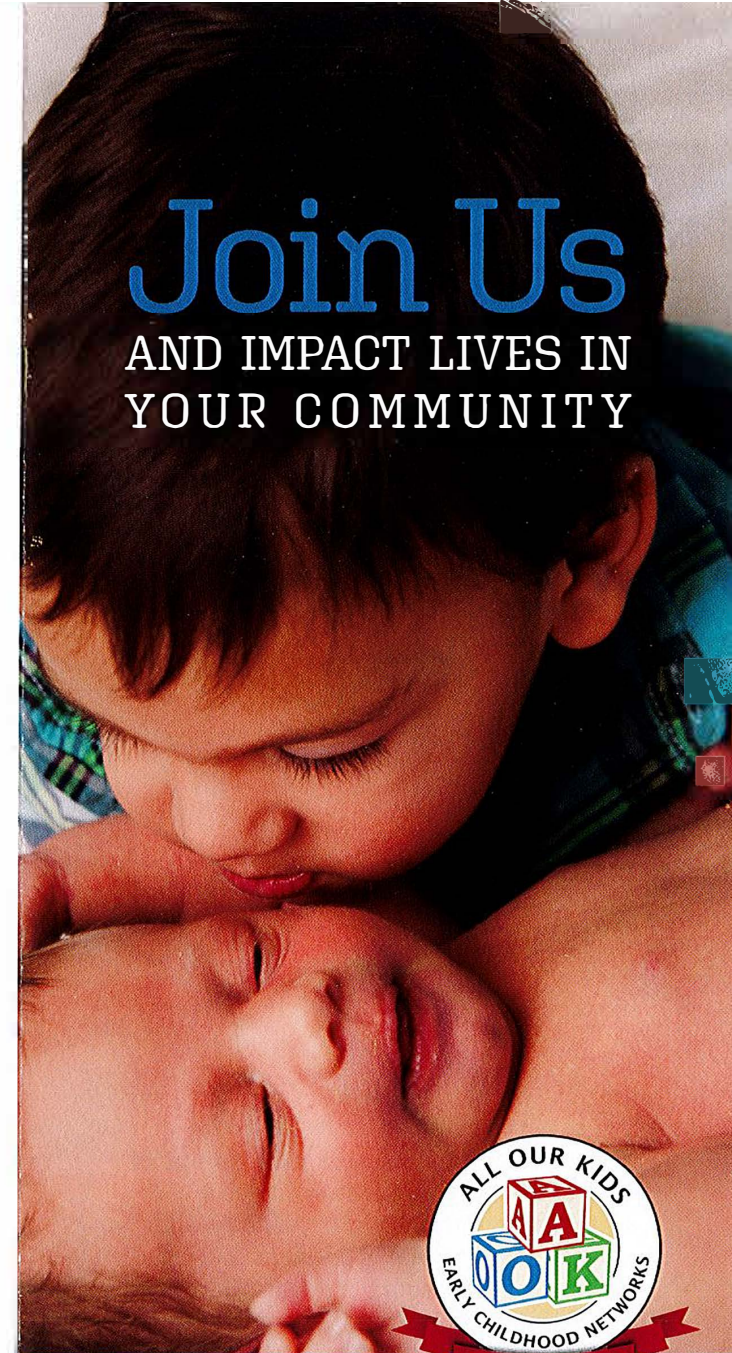

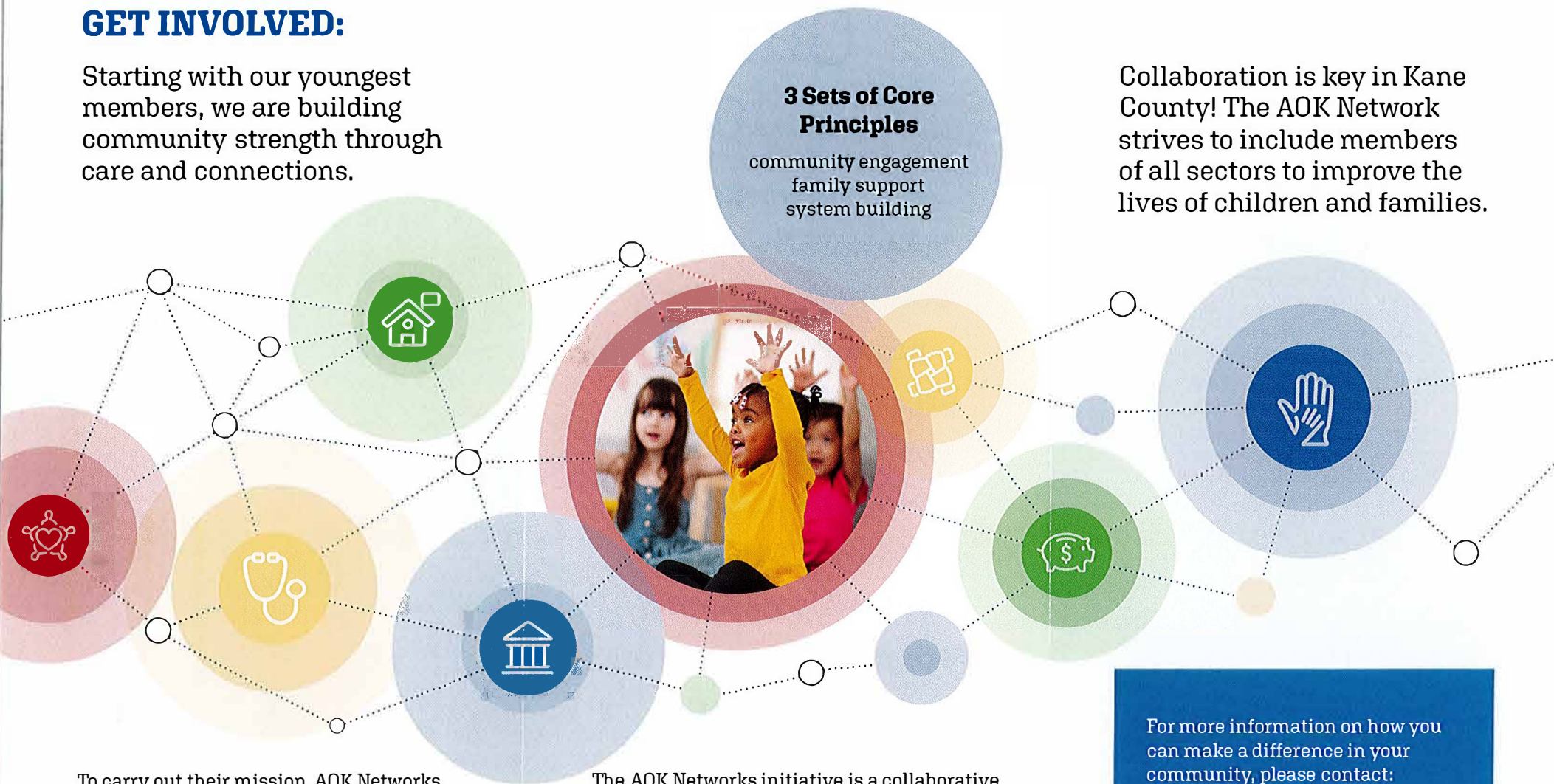


Mark your calendar
