KCHD gets funding to improve children's mental health

The Illinois Children's Healthcare Foundation has awarded the Kane County Health Department a \$200,000 planning grant to improve the system of care for children and their families. Once the initial planning year is completed, we will be eligible for an additional \$2.1 million over the following six years for implementation. This project will be a collaboration between KCHD and committed partner organizations and collaboratives working to serve the mental health needs of young people.

Department honored for excellence in public health

The Health Department was honored with a Model Practice Award at the 2018 Annual Conference of the National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO) in July. The award celebrates local health departments for developing programs that demonstrate exemplary and replicable best practices in response to a critical local public health need.
