
#### Essential Service #2

#### Take action to protect against radon

The Kane County Healthy Places Coalition and the Kane County Health Department are working to promote awareness that January is National Radon Action Month. Radon gas is naturally occurring due to the unique geology in northern Illinois. It is invisible, odorless, tasteless and is the leading cause of lung cancer among non-smokers. The only way to know if your home has a high level of radon is by testing. Test kits can be purchased at many local hardware stores (prices vary), from the American Lung Association for \$12 by calling 1-800-LUNG USA, or from the Kane County Health Department and Kane County Development Department that include both lab analysis and postage for only \$15.
