

## **Kane County Health Department Offers Forums on Suicide Prevention**

The COVID-19 pandemic forced individual into social isolation, triggering a sense of disconnection and exacerbating mental health issues both new and pre-existing. The pandemic also has strained behavioral health agencies. Nationally, there has been a rise in suicidal ideation among youth and local school mental health professionals have reported a dramatic increase in student mental health needs during past school year.

In response, the Kane County System of Care – led by the Kane County Health Department - has organized a series of forums and training opportunities for initiatives in Suicide Prevention during Suicide Awareness Month. The events are as follows:
