### **Frozen burrito products recalled; may be contaminated with listeria**

The Kane County Health Department is advising that the Green Chile Food Company, a Las Cruces, N.M. establishment, is recalling approximately 252,854 pounds of ready-to-eat (RTE) meat and poultry frozen burrito products because they may be adulterated with *Listeria monocytogenes*, according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS).

There have been no confirmed reports of illness due to consumption of these products, however the items were shipped to institutions, retail stores and distribution centers in California, Illinois, Oregon, and South Dakota.

The ready-to-eat meat and poultry frozen burrito items were produced and packaged on various dates between March 8, 2017 and May 10, 2017. The following products are subject to recall: [[View Labels](#) (PDF Only)]. The products subject to recall bear establishment number "M-21740 or P-21740" inside the USDA mark of inspection.

Listeriosis can cause fever, muscle aches, headache, stiff neck, confusion, loss of balance and convulsions sometimes preceded by diarrhea or other gastrointestinal symptoms. An invasive infection spreads beyond the gastrointestinal tract. In pregnant women, the infection can cause miscarriages, stillbirths, premature delivery or life-threatening infection of the newborn. In addition, serious and sometimes fatal infections in older adults and persons with weakened immune systems.

Consumers who have purchased these products are urged not to consume them. These products should be thrown away or returned to the place of purchase.
